It's hard to say what the lowest point of Joseph's life was: the betrayal of his brothers throwing him in the pit; convincing their father, Jacob, that he was mauled by an animal, being sold into slavery, or going to prison for something he did not do. The Bible story about Joseph is one of deep darkness and betrayal; yet we see Josehp continuing to serve faithfully.

Joseph recognized God's presence regardless of his circumstances, and remained faithful no matter the cost.

We are often tempted to stop serving when we go through difficulties, or when we think our impact is insignificant due to our position. Even as a slave, Joseph trusted God and remained faithful and served diligently, showing Potiphar that God was real.

We are called to be faithful stewards of a priceless treasure – God's Kingdom. We are called to manage His resources and carry out His work with unwavering loyalty. Just as an overseer diligently tends to a household, we are entrusted with tasks that have eternal implications. Our service isn't merely a duty but a privilege that reflects our devotion to the Master. As we await His return, let us be faithful stewards, ensuring that our actions align with His purposes.

Let others be drawn to the glorious message of eternal hope and salvation through Jesus Christ because of our conduct.
